I hope that you all had an inspiring holiday season filled with beautiful music. We are so fortunate to have so many musical choices available all year, but especially around the holidays. As we begin a new year, your local AGO chapter has several exciting events coming up.

The Hauptwerk System allows one to connect an electronic organ console to a computer to sample pipe organs from around the world. John Homko will host two events in his home to demonstrate his system. We are limiting participation to twelve at each identical event to give attendees an opportunity for some hands-on experience.

Several members of our chapter have harpsichords of various styles, prompting us to put them all together for our Harpsichord Extravaganza at St. Paul Lutheran Church in Albuquerque. Plans are still fluid at this point, but there will be opportunities to play and hear the various instruments (five are planned so far). There are talks in the works to try to do something altogether, as well. This will be an interesting and entertaining event!

Hauptwerk System Demonstration at the home of John Homko

8700 Desert Rain Rd. NW, Albuquerque NM 87120-3253

John will be doing a presentation on his Hauptwerk digital pipe organ system. Hauptwerk is a system in which an electronic organ console is attached to a computer that allows a person to play sampled instruments from around the world. The Hauptwerk system is exceptional because monumental instruments, such as those of St. Paul's Cathedral in London or Notre Dame, are sampled (recorded) note by note, and pipe by pipe. When one plays the Hauptwerk, the computer is not simply creating an imitation of a "Bourdon" or a "Krummhorn," but instead is amplifying an actual recorded sound of one individual pipe. John will provide a presentation about Hauptwerk systems generally, demonstrate his own system, and allow participants to take it for a spin. *The program is repeated so that members may choose which date they prefer, and be in a small group for the demonstration and try-out. Please indicate which session you wish attend so that we don't get everyone on one day. There will be an email sent round for response, or contact John Homko or Evelyn Henson direct.*

OBITUARY - EDDIE SALTZ 1965-2019

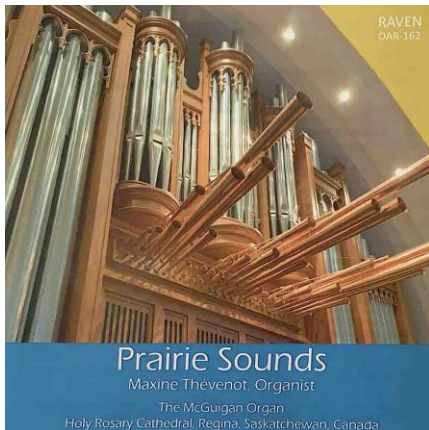
James E. Saltz III (“Eddie”) was born on March 3, 1965, in Durham, North Carolina, to James and Linda Saltz. The Saltzes raised their family – Eddie, Kristin and Matthew - in Tucumcari, New Mexico. Eddie was active in everything there – band, athletics, student government, church youth, managing the town swimming pool and serving as church organist. Eddie always loved the people and memories of Tucumcari.

Eddie began his music career during high school as organist of Center Street Methodist Church in Tucumcari, NM. He studied organ under the direction of Robert Parkins, University Organist at Duke Memorial Chapel, earning a degree in Psychology and Music from Duke in 1987 and continued in repertoire and church music during his time at Baylor Dental School in Dallas. Eddie furthered his music studies for several years under the mentorship of Dr. David Heller, Professor and Chair of the Music Department and University Organist at Trinity University, San Antonio.

Eddie served as organist at Ridgewood Park United Methodist Church in Dallas from 1990-1997, at First Presbyterian Church in Albuquerque from 2002-2009, and at Christ Evangelical Lutheran Church in Santa Fe from 2017-2019. In between his permanent positions, Eddie substituted at a variety of other churches. He was an active member of AGO during his years in Albuquerque, served as Treasurer of the local chapter, attended multiple national and regional conventions, and helped organize the regional conference held in Albuquerque and Santa Fe in 2009.

Eddie died on August 25, 2019, in Santa Fe. He loved people and people couldn’t resist loving him back. He had a passion for helping the underprivileged in the community. Eddie was a gifted musician on organ and piano and he shared his gifts generously. He also enjoyed traveling, swimming, running, and being out in the sun, especially at the beach. He is survived by Kristin Potter of Santa Fe, Donna Saltz and her children, his beloved grandsons Donovan and Salvatore, Eddie’s mother, sister and brother, five nieces, and his aunt, uncle and cousins.

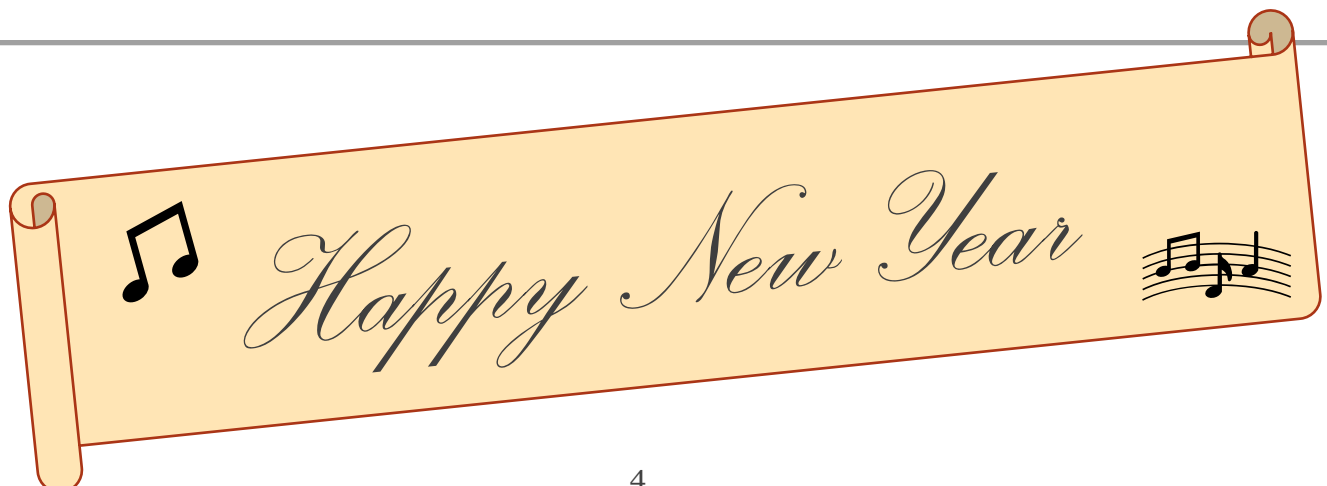
AUGUST HUYBRECHTS

During a brief visit with 99-year old and previously active chapter member August Huybrechts, I learned fascinating facts about a life overflowing with musical contribution. August's family in Belgium were all expected to be organists. When he was 9 and the church had no organist one day, August's father sent him to play. While August was of an age to study for years with Flor Peeters, his older brother competed with Peeters, hoping for the appointment that Peeters got, probably as first organist in 1925 at the cathedral in Mechelen. Failing to achieve a juicy post in a small world, the brother emigrated. August followed and spent most of his life as music educator and organist in Wisconsin. In Albuquerque he was, for many years, organist at Our Lady of the Assumption Catholic Church. As in so much of our classical music culture in the US, we are indebted to European musicians like August for bringing us high standards and good music.

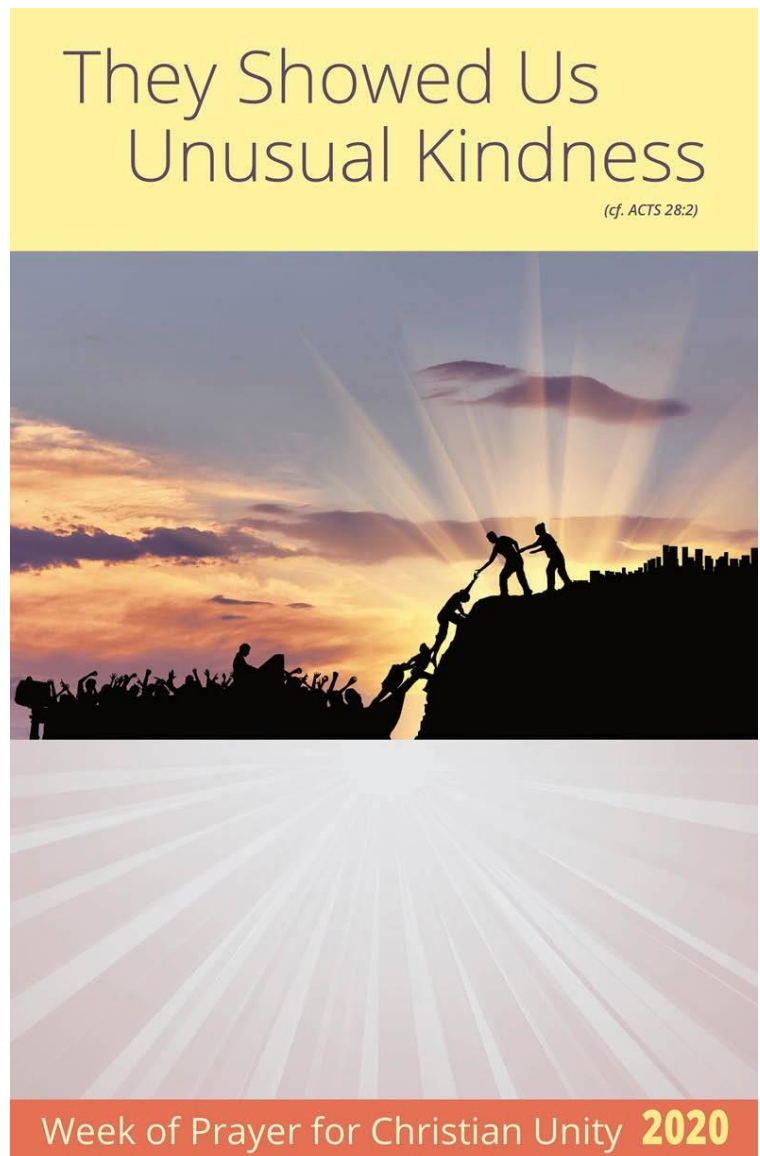

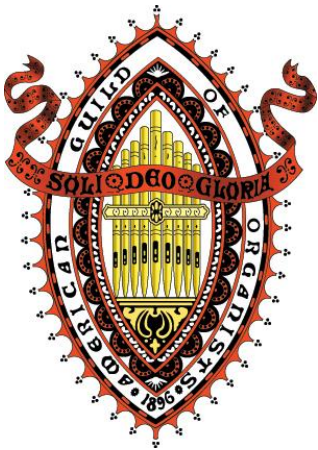
