NOTES FROM THE DEAN



Greetings!

I hope you are maintaining your health, both physical and spiritual. We are not the first musicians to be hamstrung by a pandemic. The other day I listened to an event with conductor Anthony Barrese, who shared a number of stories of past composers who lived through health crises. Claudio Monteverdi's career was interrupted for nearly a decade by various epidemics in Italy. Stravinsky, Bartok, and Rachmaninoff each caught the Spanish flu in 1918. Each experienced not only poor health, but the disappointment of lost opportunity. Bach's Cantata 25 was focused on the pain and stress of life in a pandemic.

As I reflect on the experiences of our musical forbears, I realize how much we have for which to be thankful. Many of us have pianos, harpsichords, and organs in our homes through which we make music, if only for ourselves (in my case, my dog often sings along!). We can connect with others through totally safe electronic media. We are able to enjoy an unlimited variety of music through recordings.

I would like to draw your attention to the opportunities offered to you by the AGO. If you are like me, you have always preferred AGO's in-person events and have not availed yourself of any online "opportunities" in the past, except maybe the classified ads when you are looking for a new church position. Agoabq.org offers many kinds of educational opportunities and resources; I can't even begin to list everything you can find there! Agoabq.org, our chapter's website, offers performances, educational resources and links to many outside groups and events. As a chapter, we continue to hope to have live events this season eventually and we will soon release the video presentation on the new Schoenstein instrument in Tulsa.

The AGO is working hard to support organists who face loss of income, loss of practice space, or any other issues related to COVID-19. If you face challenges with which the Guild can help, please let me know. In the meantime, stay well and hopefully we will be together soon.

Ann Labounsky is the author of Jean Langlais: The Man and His Music, and she has recorded the complete works of Langlais issued through voixduventrecordings. She is chair of Organ and Sacred Music at Duquesne University. A former AGO councilor for education as well as a past dean of the Pittsburgh chapter, Ann serves as organist/director at Church of the Redeemer in Squirrel Hill, Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania.

Ain't No Sunshine: cellist Jacob Barker


