HYMN PLAYING AND SINGING WITH AGO GUSTO – REPORT

Our Albuquerque Chapter hosted its second chapter event of this season, “Hymn Playing and Singing with Gusto,” at the Church of the Incarnation (Rio Rancho, NM). **Pastor Fr. Michael Garcia and Mrs. Elizabeth Illerbrun**, Director of Music and Liturgy, welcomed members, guests and attendees who numbered over 70, an excellent turnout for a small chapter.

Eight professional players were joined by three student organists (two 10th and one 12th grader). Each organist chose one or two favorite hymns for an informal hymn singing fest, showcasing their leadership and interpretive skills. The enthusiastic congregation sang nineteen tunes, including gems like Abbot’s Leigh, Duke Street, Winchester New, Two Oaks, Aurelia, Lauda Anima, and King’s Weston. The three manual Allen digital organ filled the 1000-seat, acoustically resonant church beautifully.

Chapter Dean Jeremy Wirth introduced the Albuquerque chapter to visitors, highlighting the A.G.O.’s promotion of music through educational and service events. Organist participants represented various faiths, including Lutheran, United Methodist, Episcopal, Presbyterian, Congregational, The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, and Roman Catholic.

Enjoy works by **Bach, Drischner, Dupré, Frederick Swann**, and **Aaron David Miller** in this afternoon organ recital. This concert is co-sponsored by the Albuquerque Chapter of the American Guild of Organists.

Hailed as “A world-class virtuoso” and “an expert at defining darks, lights, shadows and colors,” Bradley Hunter Welch is increasingly in demand as a recitalist, concerto soloist, and collaborative artist. A native of Knoxville, TN, Bradley holds the Doctor of Musical Arts, Master of Musical Arts, Master of Music degrees, and the Artist Diploma from Yale University where he studied with Thomas Murray and Martin Jean. He also holds the Bachelor of Music degree magna cum laude from Baylor University where he studied with Joyce Jones.

Dr. Welch is the 2003 First Place winner of the Dallas International Organ Competition and was also awarded the Audience Prize for the second time, having previously won it in 2000. He was Director of Music & Arts at Highland Park United Methodist Church in Dallas, TX from 2009 to 2014 and currently devotes his full-time attention to a thriving solo concert career.
